McKinley Addition/Renovation Project Update

As a result of the 2012 Arlington Public Schools (APS) system wide capacity and facilities studies, an expansion to McKinley Elementary School was proposed and approved by the School Board. The project started a year ago with the design phase and went through a Building Level Planning Committee (BLPC) process designed for community input and consensus.

Throughout this year-long process we had strong support of McKinley parents, Madison Manor residents, and MMCA representatives on the BLPC. We also received wonderful input and support from community members throughout the planning process, and particularly at the December community meeting. This collective community support had a significant impact on the final design plans and made a difference in very real terms!

I am happy to report that the Arlington County Board recently approved the McKinley Elementary School expansion and renovation plan. APS plans to build approximately 40,445 square foot of new additions at McKinley, in three locations, including:

- a primary addition - approximately 33,040 gross square feet - at the northeast corner of the existing building
- a secondary addition - approximately 6,261 gross square feet - to replace the existing pentagon addition on the southwest corner of the school
- 1,175 gross square foot addition to renovate and expand the main entry and school administration offices on the east side of the school

The project also includes approximately 8,835 square feet of demolition in the gymnasium and pentagon wing, for a net increase of about 32,250 square feet.

The primary addition will be faced with brick, glass, and fiber cement panels. It will provide 10 new classrooms, two new art rooms, and two new music rooms. In addition, the current gymnasium will be expanded to provide a place for the entire school community to gather. The gymnasium will have a stage so that it can also be used as an auditorium. There will also be improvements to the crosswalk in front of the school across McKinley Road and pedestrian access to 11th Street.

The estimated total project cost is \$20.5 million. It is expected to be completed by September 2016 with funding from the 2012 and 2014 bond referenda.

As a member of the BLPC, I feel the planning process was truly a successful endeavor. I believe the final plans approved by the Country Board will lead to a wonderful new school for our children, school staff, and will be a tremendous asset to our community at large.

I would like to extend a special thanks to BLPC committee members Ben Thompson, Errin Matechak, Grace Gan, and John Giambalvo for all their hard work and countless hours spent in the McKinley library for all of our meetings over the past year!

For myself, it's been a lot of fun doing this with you all over the years, and I'll miss you!




