ASK MADISON

Dear Madison,

My neighbor has a tree that looks like it could fall onto our house any minute. They don't seem so concerned. What can I do?

-- hanging on a limb

Dear Hanging:

First, all of us should consider our trees as part of our homes and maintain them. Have a qualified tree company provide you with an evaluation of all your trees and have them trimmed every few years. This falls under "an ounce of prevention being worth the pound of cure" scenario.

In the meantime, talk to your neighbor again. There could be a financial barrier to their reluctance or maybe they have had an arborist who has said everything is fine. Your options in Arlington County are somewhat limited. The County does not have a program to financially help homeowner's with tree removal. They do have the authority to declare a tree "dangerous", but only if it is deemed a PUBLIC threat (hanging over streets, parks, sidewalks, schools, etc.). Utility companies will trim if their wires are blocked.

Get an arborist out to examine the tree from your own property and, if suggested, you are allowed to trim back to your own property line, but this will have to be done at your own expense. This is certainly a better option than paying a deductible with your insurance company after the tree has fallen. Arlington County recommends www.treesaregood.com.
